### Order of the Department of Commercial Registration

No. 161/2544

Re: Extension of Scope of Duties and Responsibilities of the Central Business Registration Unit and Offices of Business Registration Services 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7\*

---

Whereas the Department of Commercial Registration has established Offices of Business Registration Services 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 and the areas of responsibility and functions have already been prescribed for each Office of Business Registration, viz. the duties and responsibilities of registering businesses with head offices situated in the responsible area, it appears that, at present, commercial businesses have expanded along with an increase in the tasks within the functions of the Department of Commercial Registration. Furthermore, the Department of Commercial Registration has completed the development of a computerised registration data processing system to a certain level.

Therefore, in order to improve the speed and convenience of services rendered and facilitate business operators and the visiting public, the Department of Commercial Registration hereby extends the scope of duties and responsibilities of the Central Business Registration Unit and the 7 Offices of Business Registration Services, as follows:

1. Commercial registration under the Commercial Registration Act B.E. 2499 (1956) for entities with head offices situated in the area of Bangkok Metropolis without any area limit.
2. Registration of partnerships and limited companies under the Civil and Commercial Code on partnerships and companies for entities with head offices situated in the area of Bangkok Metropolis without any area limit.
3. Registration of change, termination and winding-up of partnerships and companies registered under 2. without any area limit.
